PEOPLE'S HEALTH CLINIC TO PARTNER WITH EYECARE4KIDS

The People's Health Clinic is adding extended vision care to its ever expanding network of partners who are committed to providing health care to the uninsured. EyeCare4Kids will offer vision care one day a month at the People's Health Clinic, offering both detection and treatment of vision problems as well as affordable prescription eyeglasses for both children and adults.

EyeCare4Kids will kick off the partnership on Wednesday, September 28 by seeing patients in SeeMore, their mobile clinic, which will be parked in the People's Health Clinic parking lot. Beginning Wednesday October 26th, EyeCare4Kids will see patients one Wednesday each month inside the clinic. Appointments will be necessary.

EyeCare4Kids estimates that 25% of school-age children in Utah have vision problems which if not detected and treated early, can lead to problems in school, with learning and impact negatively on a child's development.

"We are thrilled to enter into this new partnership with EyeCare4Kids," said Nann Worel, executive director of the People's Health Clinic. "Our organizations share similar missions and the additional resources that EyeCare4Kids will bring to the vision services already available at the People's Health Clinic will be invaluable to our patients."

Established in 1999, the People's Health Clinic is a community funded clinic whose mission is to provide health care for the uninsured of Summit and Wasatch counties.
